DESTINY FAMILY An Important Note From Our Church Council

At the end of 2023, we invited our denomination's financial team to come and audit our facilities and finances. We, the church Council, found the visit and review very insightful and helpful. Foursquare gave us a list of some organizational shifts we need to make. Some will be required for us to comply more fully with IRS and Foursquare regulations. And others are recommendations.

Please cover our team in prayer as we work through implementing these changes, in phases, throughout this year and the next. The Council manages many prayerful decisions concerning our facilities and finances every month, and we need the wisdom of Christ.

One of the shifts we need to make immediately is the collection of funds for individuals and/or specific ministries. Per instruction from our financial review:

According to IRS Publication 526 on rules governing the tax deductibility of charitable gifts, contributions earmarked to individuals are expressly not tax deductible. Allowing donations to pass through the church without control of those funds resting at the church violates this regulation and potentially jeopardizes the tax-exempt status of the Foursquare denomination.

The church must not receive funds designated for an individual [or a specific ministry]. The church must receive funds from either the general fund or a fund set up by the Church Council. Funds may be disbursed out of these donor-restricted funds at the direction of the church Council and not a donor.

WHAT THIS MEANS: **Effective immediately, Destiny can no longer accept checks written or directed to a specific person or ministry.** I.e., a check written to "Destiny Foursquare Church" with the request/memo for it to go towards "Pastor Suzy." Another example would be a check written to "Destiny" with a memo to have it go towards a specific ministry, such as "Via Love International."

As an alternative, you will see and hear Destiny collecting offerings, such as on our Missional Giving Sundays, towards our MISSIONAL FUND. We will share about *Via Love International*, as an example, and then collect money towards the MISSIONAL FUND. The Council can then decide to fund *Via Love* from that offering. According to the IRS, the Council, not the donor, must direct the funds. As another example, Destiny can share about a family in need and then ask for giving towards our established BENEVOLENCE FUND. The Council can then decide to give the totality of that offering to said family.

Lastly, suppose you want to continue to support Judah and Candace's church plant, for example. In that case, you must give to their ministry directly, not through Destiny. If you want to bless someone in our congregation, you must do it directly and not process it through the church.

Another change we are making **at the end of February** is **discontinuing the use of PayPal and Tithe.ly as digital giving options.** It was recommended that we narrow down our focus to one option. Per the financial review, "Using more than one system is cumbersome and more arduous for the bookkeeper to reconcile. We recommend the church consolidate its electronic giving options to one merchant provider to simplify the process."

Giving digitally at <u>www.mydestiny.family/give</u>, via text messaging, and through the Church Center app will continue to be available options as they are all processed through the same secure organization that we use to manage donations.

Thank you for your understanding and grace as we navigate change.
